OUR LIVES IN LIBERIA



One of our great victories in Liberia has been to put in place a Memorandum of Understanding between MAF and Samaritan's Purse (SP). Both organisations operate Cessna Caravans in this country, and both do amazing work transporting essential supplies & personnel around the country, as well as spreading the gospel message. With the right paperwork in place, we're able to borrow the SP engineers, and vice versa, to help out on their aircraft when the need arises as a lack of engineers is always a problem! It's so good having this partnership, to work together so we can all be more effective in our ministries.



I started leading a ladies Bible study group within Liberia in September, 2023, taking over from the previous leader who has now transitioned back to the United States. For the last few weeks, the women have been working through my latest book, *No Mountain Immovable*, exploring the chapter of Hebrews 11 in the Bible. Each week we enjoy some coffee and cake together, and then spend a bit of time sharing what's been going on in our lives and any prayer requests. We then pray together, before opening our Bibles and discussing what we find there. It's an amazing time of refreshing for us all every Thursday morning.

MAF IN ACTION—STORIES FROM THE FIELD

MAF's work in Liberia is high-impact, saving our partners days of travel as they bring help, hope and healing to the people living in places hard to reach by road. Here are just a few stories from the many people we've flown recently:

- Rev Emmanuel K Zabay Sr flew with special guests to an Assemblies of God conference in the south of Liberia (pictured). Leaders attended from many churches in rural
 - areas, and were encouraged and refreshed by the teaching of a speaker who was on the flight. Instead of needing time for recovery after a long and arduous car journey, the conference could begin the day the flight arrived. "MAF Liberia service is fast and safe, we rely on MAF service for help and we enjoy the quick response from the team," Rev Zabay said. "The light is shining in dark places because of MAF's vision."
- The selling of bush meat is a big problem in Liberia, with chimpanzees, monkeys, elephants and other protected species often killed for food. We were recently able to fly Comfort Davies, a former seller of bush
 - meat, and Peaches Cummeh, awareness and ecotourism officer at the Forestry Development Authority, on a mission to educate local women about the importance of Liberia's diverse animal life. "If it was not for MAF, it would be difficult to get rid of bush meat selling within Liberia," Peaches said.
- On a recent trip with MAF, Rev Wellington Greene was able to train local church leaders, and share the gospel message.
 "Twenty-two people said they wanted to accept Christ and, based on the time available, we were able to baptise 16 people... Souls got saved in Zwedru, because of MAF."
